



[Korean for Basic]

SHORT COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is a basic-level Korean language course designed for learners who have some prior knowledge of Korean. It aims to develop learners' communicative competence by learning and practicing vocabulary and expressions commonly used in everyday life. As a basic course, it focuses on improving students' ability to use fundamental grammar and vocabulary beyond the beginner level, helping them strengthen their overall Korean proficiency. The course is organized around a variety of topics related to daily life, enabling learners to engage in more authentic and meaningful communication in Korean.

READING MATERIALS

The textbook for this course is *Sungkyun Korean 1: Vocabulary and Grammar*.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND GRADING

All ISS classes are graded on a pass/fail basis, determined by students' academic achievement on a 100-point scale.

A total score of **60 points or higher** is required to pass the course.

According to SKKU regulations, students must attend **at least 80% of all classes** to receive a passing grade.

Active participation in class activities and completion of assignments are essential for successful course completion.

The final grade consists of the following components:

- Written Test (Final writing test): **80 points**
 - Class Participation (Active engagement during class): **10 points**
 - Assignment: **10 points**
- Total: 100 points**
